Admission Requirements

Students are admitted to the program after admission to UAS and declaring an English major. At the time of admission, they will be assigned to an academic advisor in the humanities department.

Candidates must complete the General Education

Graduation Requirement (http://catalog.uas.alaska.edu/

the specific program requirements listed below. Courses may not
be used to fulfill more than one requirement in the B.A. program.
Students must complete 42 credits of upper-division courses
(24 of these must be UAS credits). A maximum of 12 credits of
independent study may be applied toward the B.A. in English.

The B.A. in English provides a broad foundation in the liberal arts as well as specialized training in language and literature. The program is designed to provide students with knowledge of English and American literature and culture and their multicultural contexts, and advanced skills in critical reading, research, writing, speaking, and problem solving. This degree can be completed on the Juneau campus or fully online, or a combination of both.
